Dear Parents,

There is a saying in English that "time flies". And, so it does. Although we are already in the second quarter of school, we would still like to welcome our new and returning parents. Please feel free to visit my office or Ajarn Somchai, our new Thai Principal, any time you have a concern or you would just like to talk. You are most welcome.

We are happy to announce that by the end of October (hopefully) we plan to move into our new kindergarten building. The building will include a cafeteria and library for kindergarten students. Kindergarten grades prep- center (preschool), K1 (2 sections) and K2 will move to the new building.

Multi-grades 2 – 4 will move to the vacated kindergarten building, which will also house multi-grades K2 – 1 as well as K3. Music and Thai classes will be taught in the new building. The landscaping may not be completed, so parents will continue to drop-off and pick-up their children at the old kindergarten building until further notice. We will give more detail before the move.

In order to ensure better security for the Australian Village, all private gates have been closed. Residents can use a side gate to exit and enter. The hours that the gate is opened are:

7:00 – 9:00 A.M., Monday – Friday,

3:00 – 5:30 P.M., Monday - Thursday

3:00 to 4:00 P.M. on Friday.

We have contracted with the Roads and Highway Department to make a walkway from the gate to AIMS. This will have been completed by the time this newsletter is published.

Please remember that the Parent/Teacher Conference for the first quarter will be November 6, 2016. We cordially request that all our parents attend. You will have the opportunity to ask questions you may have as well as to get better acquainted with your child's teachers.

# PATHFINDER INDUCTION CEREMONY




