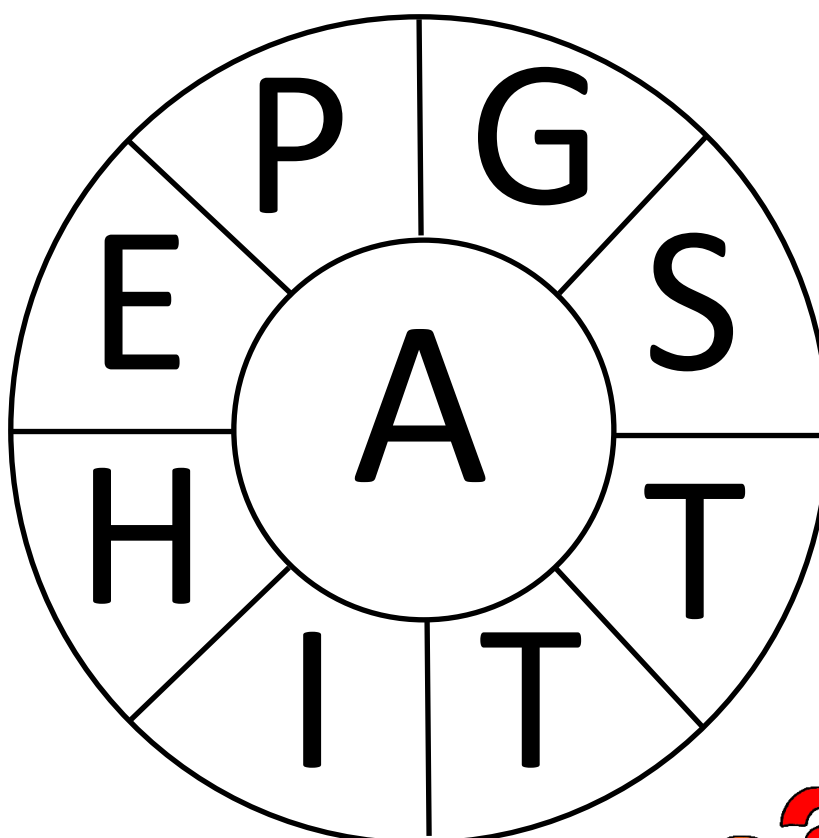




Word Wheel Challenge
